

Budget

The Sheboygan Area School District Board of Education approved a total budget of \$167,842,049 for the 2017-18 school year.

The district's current fund balance of \$34,615,980 is equal to 28% of the general and special education fund budget.

Innovative Initiatives

Local business partners have invested over \$4 million to build state-of-the-art technical education labs in both North and South High School. The Kohler | Johnsonville Advanced Technology Centers officially opened in October 2016, adding over 12,000 sq. ft. of additional learning space.

Our district Wellness Program supports and promotes an environment focused on health and well-being for staff and families. Free exercise classes, fitness challenges, and wellness promotions are offered year round. Our on-site Sheboygan County InHealth Clinic offers free wellness exams and health care for employees and their families.

Treasured Traditions

- Our annual joint graduation ceremony includes students from all five high schools and is held outdoors in Vollrath Park.
- Each year, our high school students design, build and sell a home in our community. This year, students are building their 20th home. The last home sold for over \$300,000.
- Heritage School, a restored 1870's school house experience, is a memorable field trip for all fourth grade students. Through a partnership with the Heritage School Council, the school is maintained as a 'living school museum' and is open to all residents of Sheboygan County.






SASD At A Glance

- 1,300 teachers, support staff, and administrators
- 10,300 students in early childhood through grade 12.
- 26 Schools - 1 Early Learning Center, 13 elementary schools, 2 4K-8 schools, 5 middle schools, and 5 high schools.
- 9 charter schools are supported by local independent governing boards that have a charter agreement with the Sheboygan Area School District Board of Education.
- Members of the Fox River Classic Conference, one of the premier athletic conferences in Wisconsin!
- Opportunities for collaboration exist with nearby colleges and universities including the Lakeland University, Lakeshore Technical College and University of Wisconsin – Sheboygan.
- Staff and students benefit from strong community support, collaboration with local businesses and organizations, and a high level of parental involvement in the schools.
- The District includes the City of Sheboygan and portions of the surrounding townships. Our nine-member Board of Education is committed to maintaining positive relationships with school staff as well as ensuring we offer the best educational opportunities for the students in our community.

Experience Counts

Board members, staff, parents, students and community members are proud of the many creative and dedicated people employed here. Teachers in the Sheboygan Area School District are committed to excellence, which is evidence with 70% having earned Master's Degrees and 19 teachers having earned the highest level of certification, National Board Certification.



- Nearly **85%** of SASD teachers have five years or more teaching experience.
- SASD Teachers are recognized as leaders in our schools, our community and in their professional fields.
- In 2016, AARP named Sheboygan as one of the top 10 great places to live on less than \$40K.
- In 2015, Sheboygan placed among the top 50 places in the nation for teachers to work.
- According to the GoodCall research data, Sheboygan ranked 48th in the nation based on average teacher salary and high school graduation rate. The GoodCall data also showed the city boasts a low cost of living and favorable amenities.




Collaboration and Support

- **New Teachers** - The Sheboygan Area School District supports first year teachers in their transition from theory to practice through teacher mentors. A three-day workshop is held prior to the start of the school year is designed to welcome and familiarize new teachers with the Sheboygan Area School District.
- **School days are shortened for students each Wednesday** to make time available for collaboration between teachers, departments, and schools for staff meetings, curriculum work, committee meetings and district initiatives.
- **Common planning time** and professional learning communities (PLCs).
- **Teacher Development Institute** – On-site classes are offered by Lakeland University and taught by professional educators including SASD employees. The courses will carry graduate credits and will be offered in a cohort format, with a maximum of 30 teachers per cohort. Each cohort of teachers that successfully completes the series of classes will be moved up one step on the district's salary schedule.

Innovative Technology-rich Environment

Technology is a critical part of teaching and preparing our students for college and career readiness.

The Sheboygan Area School District utilizes the Google (GSuite) for Education platform. Teachers are able to collaborate with other staff members and also with students in the GSuite environment. Teachers are also issued a Macbook Air laptop for school use.

Students in the Sheboygan Area School District have ample access to technology. We have a robust infrastructure which supports over 10,000 devices. Our middle and high school students are provided a Chromebook for use at school and at home. Elementary schools are also utilizing technology at the 4K-5 grade levels. Students in 4K have 4 iPads per classroom and grades K-2 have access to iPad Minis on a 1:2 ratio. Students in grades 3-5 utilize Chromebooks in a 1:1 carted environment to offer enrichment and support within the school day.

Technology Learning and Innovation Coaches are assigned to each school building to offer one-on-one training, group training sessions, and support for integrating technology into the classroom.
