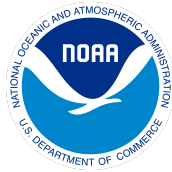

## **Get into Your Sanctuary! A Workshop for Educators and Students**

The Wisconsin Shipwreck Coast National Marine Sanctuary (WSCNMS), Wisconsin Sea Grant, and Wisconsin Historical Society are excited to announce our summer 2023 in-person workshop in Sheboygan, Wisconsin.

This two-day workshop aboard the UW-Milwaukee research vessel [R/V Neeskay](#) is aimed at both educators and students, with a day dedicated to each group. This hands-on experience is designed to foster a deeper connection to Lake Michigan's natural and cultural resources.

### **For educators**

This professional learning opportunity provides experiential learning centered on maritime archaeology, marine technology, and environmental science and will include:

1. designing and executing an archaeological investigation of a historic shipwreck using historical research and a remotely operated vehicle;
2. conducting water quality sampling;
3. an opportunity to provide insights and feedback to the sanctuary to help further refine this program and ensure future programming meets educator needs.



We encourage both experienced and educators new to Great Lakes literacy to apply. **A stipend will be provided to cover participation and travel. We invite educators at the 4th through 12th grade level to apply.**

### **For students**

This opportunity provides a day of experiential learning centered on maritime archaeology, marine technology, and environmental science including:

1. participation in an archaeological investigation of a historic shipwreck using a remotely operated vehicle;

2. exploration of the tools, techniques and technology of this professional practice;
3. hands-on water quality sampling

Students will experience activities on board the R/V Neeskey as well as landside in Sheboygan.

Youth ages 12 and over are encouraged to apply.

### More about the WSCNMS

Designated in 2021, Wisconsin Shipwreck Coast National Marine Sanctuary provides stewardship for our nation's maritime heritage in Lake Michigan. Co-managed by NOAA and the state of Wisconsin, the sanctuary expands on the state's 30-year management of these historic sites, bringing new opportunities for research, resource protection, and education. The sanctuary also supports broader Great Lakes conservation by facilitating multidisciplinary research with a wide range of government, non profit, and university partners. In partnership with local communities, the sanctuary provides a national stage for promoting recreation and heritage tourism. The 36 historic shipwreck sites within the sanctuary represent vessels that played a central role in building the nation between the 1830s and 1930s. Twenty-seven are listed on the National Register of Historic Places and research suggests that another 60 shipwrecks may yet to be discovered.
