By agreeing to this document both student and parent understand and agree to the provisions and conditions of this agreement. Both student and parent must sign this form and understand that access to the Internet is given to our students in a filtered environment. An increasing number of our educational resources are web-based which means that Internet access is a requirement for providing our students with the best possible educational experience

The Internet is a worldwide collection of interconnected computer networks that make it possible to share information almost instantly. It is the intent of the Sheboygan Area School District to make Internet access available to further the learning of students in the District. There is great potential for students to use the Internet as a learning resource to: participate in distance learning activities, ask questions of and consult with experts, communicate and share their work with other students and individuals, and to locate material to meet their educational and personal information needs.

On this global network, it is impossible to control all materials. Student users may discover inappropriate information. Through the Internet, students may have access to materials that are illegal, pornographic, violent, defamatory, inaccurate, or otherwise objectionable. The Sheboygan Area School District believes that the educationally appropriate information and interactions available through the worldwide network outweighs the possibility that, despite the best efforts of the District, student users may access materials that are not consistent with the educational goals of the District.

The District will be taking precautions to restrict access to inappropriate and objectionable materials by:

- requiring a user agreement form;
- maintaining careful direction and supervision of students appropriate to their age;
- utilizing Internet filtering for visual depictions of materials that are obscene, child pornography or harmful to minors;
- enforcing the rules for use.

Students using Sheboygan Area School District facilities to access the Internet must abide by the rules on the reverse of this page. Violation of the rules may result in revocation of Internet privileges, and/or other school disciplinary action and/or police referral, if laws are violated. Internet usage is a privilege, not a right.

HIGH SCHOOL INTERNET RULES

Students using Sheboygan Area School District facilities to use the Internet or other services must follow these rules, agreeing that:

- A. Use of the Internet or other services must be in support of education or research and be consistent with the policies and objectives of the District.
- B. Use of the network to facilitate illegal activity is prohibited.
- C. Use of the network to access obscene or pornographic materials is prohibited.
- D. Any use for commercial or for-profit purposes is prohibited, including product/advertisement. This also includes buying, selling, and bartering, including but not limited to the use of credit cards.
- E. Disruption of the Internet/on-line service, supporting equipment, or information available on it is prohibited, including but not limited to tampering with hardware or software, vandalizing data, introducing or using computer viruses, attempting to gain access to restricted information or networks, or violating copyright law.
- F. Students may not use their personal on-line account from home.
- G. The use of Internet or other services to harass other users or to transmit materials likely to be offensive or objectionable to recipients is prohibited.
- H. Students are to protect themselves and others by not issuing their or any other persons' addresses or telephone numbers over the Internet or other on-line services, remembering that on-line communications are not private.
- I. Any problems or violations of these rules are to be reported to the supervising staff member.
