

#### who qualifies?

Students interested in attending the ASI must have a need for support to successfully complete a college education and identify as being from one or more of the following groups:

- 1. First generation college student (neither parents earned a bachelor's degree)
- 2. Historically underserved population (African American, Native American, South-Asian American, and Latinx/Hispanic)
- 3. Economically disadvantaged Submitting an application for admission to the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse is a requirement for participation. Students will also complete an ASI application and be interviewed prior to acceptance into the program. Applications for ASI are accepted until program capacity is reached (usually 15-20 students).
